Fiat!


Today we celebrate Mary's assumption into heaven; a day of great joy and gladness. We can only imagine the beatitude of Mary when she sees her son again and is enveloped in the life of the Trinity. But Mary does not go to heaven to leave us, simply to enjoy her life above. No! She is intimately concerned with the salvation and well being of her children. This is why she has appeared so frequently to bring us both warnings and comfort, the most important of which is Fatima (1917) But it is important too to look at her apparitions in Amsterdam (Our Lady of the Nations 1945-59); Japan (Aquita 1973) all approved. A very little known approved apparition at Quito 1543 concerns the very times we live in. Her apparitions at Medjugorje although still awaiting official approval, Pope Francis has deemed it a pilgrimage site are, in my opinion, important.

If we were to combine the messages, what is Our Lady saying? Although, we are in a time of great peacelessness and trial where the Devil seems to have alarming power, nevertheless we are awaiting a promised Era of Peace. The tribulations that may come upon us will depend upon how souls respond to her message of penance and conversion. She is telling her children to be awake seeking out not only their own salvation but the salvation of souls. What tools does she ask us to use?

- ◆ Persevering prayer of the heart in which we discover the God of love and hope. She wants us to talk to her and her son naturally, laying our problems before them, trusting them and in return receiving peace. Most importantly she constantly tells us to pray the rosary daily. As Jesus taught us: Watch and pray!
- ♦ The importance of the Mass and Eucharistic Adoration. Being in his presence is like the lady who touched the hem of his garment, our cares are taken care of. Even in these times when so often the Church is closed, we could drive up and spend some time next to him. A wall is no barrier for Jesus.
- ♦ Confession: Our Lady at Medjugorje recommends monthly confession.
- ♦ Be people of peace, joy and hope, which come from our faith. We need to witness to our trust and confidence in the Lord
- Fast on Wednesdays and Fridays God bless and stay close to Mary, Fr. Dominic.

Spilsby Church Garden

After a group of us studied the Pope's encyclical 'Laudato Si', we decided to work on our Church's lovely garden which was becoming rather neglected since Tony Byrne died. Vegetables were grown in raised beds at the back of the Church demonstrating a rotating crop system, and the produce was sold to help Church funds. Some fruit trees were planted plus a fig, an olive , a vine and herbs – we aimed at biblical plants though we couldn't manage a mustard seed! At the front, the borders were weeded, shrubs pruned back and new plants and bedding plants put in. Over twelve people helped, and others donated money to pay for plants. Composting beds were also made. The grotto at the front was cleaned, and roses planted round it - on a sunny day you might like to say a decade of the Rosary there.

Since then as most of us are not as young as we used to be, we have paid for a little help from a gardener, and have found that bedding plants require more watering than we can manage, especially in times of drought, so we are rethinking the planting at the front. At the back a lovely wild flower garden has been created this year by Stephen Duffy next to the new shed. The allotments and bungalow at the back belong to the Church so do come and look at everything if you visit Spilsby, relax on the benches, and enjoy God's wonderful creation.

NOTES ON LITURGY

Please make sure you read the attached letter concerning mass since at the present time attendance at mass has to be booked. Please be patient as we become familiar with the diocesan guidelines. We shall have to under government guidelines keep your postal address for 21 days.

Some other important points:

- 1. Please don't car pool and pay attention to social distancing when leaving your car.
- 2. Please follow the stewards' instructions, they have a difficult job to do but once we are in the habit it will be very smooth. It will be helpful if you bring your own sanitiser but the stewards will have some.
- 3. As the kneelers are not in use, we shall stand for the Eucharistic Prayer.
- 4. Candles: At Skegness please give Father an envelope with your intentions and a donation if you wish and he will ensure that the candles are lit for you. Or alternatively email him at the parish address opposite.
- 5. Because we are social distancing at 2 metres you do not have to wear a mask unless you wish to. If you have coronavirus symptoms please do not attend, if you feel unwell during mass please notify a steward.
- 6. Mass will be shorter <u>and the toilets are closed but if you do need to use one just see the stewards.</u>
- 7. We shall still need some more volunteers for cleaning duties.
