Dear Faithful

A new liturgical year begins this Sunday, the first of Advent. This commences once again the cycle of Our Lord's life and takes its focus from Easter 2021. Thus, Advent is a season of hope and quiet spiritual joy. It is an ancient season liturgically and is penitential in character. Why? The Christian seeks to remove from their life anything that will hinder Christ's coming. The key words in today's gospel are the three commands of Our Lord: Watch, Be on your guard and Pray.

How do we fulfil this? Especially how do we watch and keep vigil. Jesus himself has been telling us the answer in the parables that we have heard over the last few weeks in St. Matthew's gospel. A person who watches is a person that lives in expectation; who is not distracted by the things of this world that is passing but keeps their eyes fixed on the expectation of the things to come. One could perhaps say that it is not simply something that we do but the whole way we live our lives. It is also a certain paradox because we keep our mind firmly fixed on the present but in such a way that it is informed by the future.

We have to be fixed on the present because it is there the danger lies of being led astray and not keeping the oil of our love ready for the bridegroom's coming. But we do so in the hope of what is to come. We endure the trials because of the joy that is held out to us. One of the best ways practically of keeping our guard and being prepared is to do the tasks of the day, from the smallest to the greatest, for the greater glory of God. Therefore, in our tasks to do each to the best of our ability and with great love. It means doing this and persevering to the end. I have been inspired this week by these words about perseverance:

"Perseverance to the end, rooted in fidelity to Christ, means constantly keeping alive the memory of the words and person of the Lord Jesus, of everything he has taught me, everything he has done for me, everything his presence has meant in my life. It means abiding in the conviction that I cannot have my deepest identity apart from him and his action in my life. It means not compromising the truths that I have come to know since putting on the mind of Christ and begging to see the world and all reality through his eyes. It means actively choosing, against all the odds, not to stop living the life of grace first given to me at baptism, by virtue of which the eternal God himself is living his life in me. It means not valuing mere physical and psychological comfort or survival or reputation or property-all of which are ephemeral realities-above the truth that the image of God lives in each man and that, therefore, I owe each man not only respect but reverence, not only fairness but love." (Lieva Merikasis Commentary on St Matthew vol 3 p.696) God bless and a blessed Advent, Fr. Dominic.
