Fiat!

Dear Faithful,

The drama of Lent has started and the scene was set liturgically with the First Sunday of Lent – the temptation of Jesus in the desert. Our road is one of battle, the way of the cross, of self denial and purification by the fire of mercy. But the church today wants to encourage us by showing what glory awaits us by undergoing this struggle and that nothing is comparable to this. This glory awaits us not only in the life to come but already here on earth.

"The event of the transfiguration is essential for us to understand that life in Christ is about fulness of life now. Christianity is not a religion of the continual postponement of joy and delight, as some would like to caricature the Christian virtue of hope. The Transfiguration is the experience of the fulness of divine Presence, action, communication and glory now, in our very midst, in this world of passingness and disappointment." (E.Leiva Merikakis vol 2 p.531)

Jesus is showing what the whole of scripture speaks about from beginning to end: the glory of those who serve God and the necessity of the way of the cross. He tells the disciples on the way to Emmaus this truth. We see it in the first reading and Abraham's preparedness to sacrifice his son.

What we need to remember too is that this duality – glory and the cross – is also lived out historically in the life of the Church and that certainly applies to the times in which we live. We await the New Pentecost and the pouring out of the Holy Spirit which will herald the triumph of the Immaculate Heart of Mary and the era of peace that she has promised. But this necessitates a period of trial for the Church and the world so that they are purified for this event. "But where sin abounds, grace abounds more."(Rom 5:20)

But the joy of what is to happen should be our strength during these times of trial. The prophet, Ezra said that the joy of the lord is our strength. (Neh 8:10) He was speaking to the faithful remnant who after the exile had come to rebuild the city and the temple. It was a time of restoring what had been destroyed but equally of new fidelity to the law of God. We are very close to a worldwide restoration of the faith.

We need to be prepared constantly by the sacrament of confession, by ongoing consecration to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary; by the Eucharist and by prayer, especially the rosary. A soul that lives this preparedness will experience peace and joy even in the greatest of travails.

It is all summarised by the Father's simple command: "This is my Son, the beloved. Listen to him." When we follow this command with constancy, firmness and stability then the text shall also be fulfilled that we shall see only Jesus.
