Fiat!

Dear Faithful,

Let us remember the goal of Lent: to purify our minds and to deepen our union with God. The Church tells us that this cannot be done without a spiritual journey. Every spiritual journey (indeed even the great secular books about journeys) necessitate trial and temptation. It is absolutely impossible to attain heaven without having undergone tribulation.

Firstly, it takes place in a desert. Why? Only when we are prepared to come face to face with our demons without putting up any false delusions, barriers or distractions is purification able to take place. Very few people (St. Teresa's own words) are prepared to undergo this trial and persevere because the soul sees itself naked before God in all its nothingness. Therefore, to avoid this we surround ourselves with distractions. Hence the nature of Jesus' temptations: either we surrender to satanic temptations (bread, possession, power) or we throw ourselves unconditionally on the providence of God to provide.

Secondly, we need to know what our own personal demons are; how we build our defences against them. Remember temptations either come from the world, our own flesh or the devil. Many souls are not aware of temptations or their falls because they are unaware of sin. The seven deadly sins are a good place to start: Gluttony, envy, anger, lust, pride (vainglory), sloth (sadness concerning the things of God), Greed. Let us make a good examination of conscience concerning these because all sins flow in some way from one of these seven.

Thirdly, we seize on our arms: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. These are the weapons we use and they are so powerful. Fasting, for example, not only helps temper temptations to gluttony and lust but also to the others.

Fourthly, we can only conquer through the grace of Christ. Only by depending on Christ in prayer, in the sacraments, in begging in our humility for his help can we hope to achieve victory. However, at the same time we can be certain that if we stay close to him we shall conquer because in defeating the devil, Christ already gained for us the graces to succeed in all our temptations. Notice! Notice! Jesus' use of scripture. We need to have verses that spring to our lips. I also recommend the reading of the book of Exodus during Lent, since this is a book about the spiritual journey.
