Dear Faithful,


The feast of Pentecost should always fill us with hope and joy as we witness the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon Our Lady and the apostles. We see what a change this makes in their lives—now they not only believe but are ready to spread the gospel to the ends of the world. In those first conversions we see the first fruits of the Holy Spirit when three thousand people convert to following Christ; hence Pentecost is the feast of the birth of the Church. This feast has a particular importance for the times in which we are living because Pope Francis and the previous popes are calling and praying for a new Pentecost in the Church; one which will witness similar, if not greater fruits. The New Evangelization—which as baptized Christians we are called upon to participate in—cannot take place unless we are prepared to be docile to the Holy Spirit

Often we make the mistake in life of making our own plans, setting up committees, going on courses without first asking the question as to where the Spirit wishes to lead us. It is of course important that we are involved and use our reason but these are secondary to the power of the Holy Spirit. Once we open ourselves up to his gifts and his leadership, things really start to happen. It is essential if we are to progress in the spiritual life that we empty ourselves of our own self will and realize that we are servants of Christ. Once we do this and trust in the power of the Holy Spirit, we will witness a rebirth of the Church. Christ himself told the apostles that they would do greater things than they had witnessed when he was still with them (Cf Jn 14:12) However, he also told then that this was dependant upon them having faith.

We may doubt this and we may think that the marvels of the first Pentecost were a one off. But witnessing the grace that people received during the Easter liturgy shows that the Holy Spirit is still very much at work. We should take great heart from this and it is true humility to recognize this grace and acknowledge this. The Holy Spirit needs instruments through which he can blow. He tends to choose the weakest because they will be more docile. We can accomplish so much—more than we can ask for or imagine (Cf Eph 3:20) - if we but be content to be receptive to grace, empty vessels ready to be fulfilled.

Let us pray that this Pentecost be a great grace for our parish and that we recognize in everything God's providence. God bless, Fr. Dominic.
