

ALL SAINTS, ALL SOULS & NOVEMBER DEAD LIST: November begins with the feast of All Saints, a holyday of obligation, transferred this year to the Sunday before; we honour the Saints in heaven and contemplate our vocation to share Our Lord's eternal holiness in the Communion of Saints. Since we are not perfect, but need forgiveness, we pray in November, especially on All Souls' Day, 2nd, for the faithful departed, the holy souls in Purgatory, that the Lord's merciful love may perfect their love and admit them to the company of the Saints in heaven. Masses on All Souls Day will be at 10.00 am (SK), 12.00 noon (SP) and 7.00 pm (SK); churches will be open for people to pray for the holy souls: 10.45-12.00 noon and 6.00-7.00 pm (SK) and 10.30-12.00 and 5.30-7.00 (SP). Masses for those on the November Dead List (I shall offer at least 15 Masses during that month). Envelopes are available to include names of deceased members of the faithful., they will be kept also in a book kept in the sanctuary during November. **A plenary indulgence may be gained, applicable to the Holy Souls**, either by visiting a church on 2nd Nov. or on the preceding or following Sunday or on any day of Nov. and/ or else by praying for the Holy Souls in a cemetery between 1st-8th Nov. or on any one or more of eight separate days of Nov. or else, if really unable to do either through the pandemic to pray for the Holy souls at home, but in all cases by making a sacramental confession to distance themselves from sin, receiving Holy Communion and saying the Creed and the Our Father and by praying for the Pope's intentions (Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory be' and, if unable to receive these sacraments through the pandemic by firmly intending to do so as soon as possible and by an act of perfect contrition and an act of spiritual communion. Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them - may they rest in peace. Amen.

RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION: A reminder that, when we receive Holy Communion, we must be in a state of grace, must do so in faith (our response when the priest or extraordinary minister says 'The Body of Christ' of 'Amen' is a profession of faith that we are receiving Christ Himself), with attention to Him, with devotion and in prayer. If we receive on the tongue, we must be careful and not rush. If we receive in the hand, again we must be careful to receive the sacred host in the hand and we must place it immediately into the mouth and consume it there and then before the minister. This rule of the Church is so precise to ensure that we give full respect to the Lord God in the Blessed Sacrament, Whom we are receiving, that we avoid moving so as to reduce the danger of dropping the sacred host on the floor, and to avoid anyone taking the host away and out of the church where it could be used even by someone in a sacrilegious way. MEACHER ASSISTED DYING BILL: Write to MPs to oppose this Bill, which would legalise so-called assisted suicide, a form of euthanasia. **PRO-LIFE PRAYER AND ACTION:** Legislation and/or judicial sentences are advancing the deliberate suppression of innocent human life among the elderly, suffering and unborn.
