

LATEST UP-DATE ON COVID. REGULATIONS: 1. Sanitisers are to be available for all entering and leaving the church. 2. Masks may be worn by those who wish; it is encouraged during singing. 3. Social distancing is no longer needed; churches should operate up to full capacity. 4. Holy communion is to be distributed still only under one kind, the priest or minister wearing a mask during its distribution, sanitising their hands before doing so. 5. OUR MISSION IN THE CHURCH: Both the synodal process and the diocesan process emphasise mission, rooted in our becoming and being strengthened as disciples of Christ through baptism and confirmation. As I had said I would, I wrote to everyone at Pentecost, to try also to bring back to the fuller practice of their faith those dispersed perhaps through Covid or for other reasons. The Bishops' Conference also called people back to church at Pentecost: The obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holidays cannot be fulfilled virtually, except where people are physically or morally unable to attend. This I had explained in Bulletins earlier in the year. It is time for us all to begin again, to return, to welcome people back, to continue to build up the community of the Church and to witness to Christ in our parish. Please, take copies of my Pentecost letter and give them freely to those who are not yet coming to Mass, to any Catholics you may know, and to anyone whom you think may be interested in the Catholic faith. May the Holy Spirit sustain and guide us all. **DIOCESAN 'ROADSHOW' FOLLOW-UP** meeting in Boston, together with the Grantham deanery; our (Fenland) deanery will be united with Grantham deanery to form a South Lincolnshire deanery in the near future, comprising the parishes of Skegness, Boston, Sleaford, Spalding, Deeping St. James, Grantham, Stamford, Oakham and Melton Mowbray. Major changes in parishes in other parts of the diocese, taking place now or projected in the future, do not involve our parish. We were asked to identify some focuses for our parish in relation to mission: the main one of recuperating those who used to come and others remains. I believe we need to address the specific pastoral needs of tourists and also of refugees. **ECUMENICAL SERVICE IN SPILSBY REV. PETER COATES:** This could not take place last Tuesday because, unfortunately he contracted Covid. It will be rearranged once he has recovered, which we pray may be soon. GIFT AID: is a major way for charities like ourselves to earn extra income. Last year, we received £5,763-00 free money from the government because of the generosity of thirty people in the parish, who have signed up to Gift Aid their offerings. The government allows us to claim back 25p in every pound given in offerings. This is an extremely important source of extra income for us because, without it, we would have to borrow from our savings account to survive and, if that continued, it would not last long or, indeed, provide us with essential funds to do work in the parish. If you pay income tax through your wages or pension, then please sign up to Gift Aid to help your parish. It only takes a minute. All information is kept strictly confidential. You make a declaration once and then all the monies you give through your offerings can help the parish. For example, if you give £10-00 every month, your contribution to the parish is £120-00 per year; however, with Gift Aid, we can claim an extra £30-00, which means your contribution to the parish would now be £150-00. Please, consider signing up for Gift Aid. There are forms at the back of the church, for you to fill in and return to me or to Jacinta.
