

FOUR OF RELICS OF ST. BERNADETTE: at St. Bernadette's, Scunthorpe, 8.00 a.m. - 5.00 p.m. on 6th October.


St. Bernadette Soubirous, born in France in 1844, one of eight children, at the age of 14 received 18 apparitions of Our Blessed Lady between 11th February (now feast of Our Lady of Lourdes) and 16th July (feast of Our Lady of Carmel), 1858, at the Grotto of Massabielle just outside Lourdes. She prayed the Rosary, was asked to inform the local priest, and Our Lady made herself known, saying 'I am the Immaculate Conception', the dogma infallibly defined by Pope Pius IX four years before in 1854. The apparitions were authenticated by the Bishop of Tarbes in 1866, Bernadette joined the Sisters of Charity of Nevers, she was beatified in 1925 and canonised in 1933 by Pope Pius XI. Her shrine in Lourdes is especially associated with healing and prayers for the sick, with the Rosary and with conversion.

Our slot at St. Bernadette's, Scunthorpe, is booked for 12.15-12.30 p.m., though we must be there ahead of time.

The coach for St. Bernadette's Scunthorpe to honour the relics on 6th October leaves Skegness at 9.15 a.m. and Spilsby at 9.40 a.m., returning at approx. 4.00 p.m. at Spilsby and 4.30 p.m at Skegness. We shall recite the Rosary on the coach on the way to and from Scunthorpe. There will be Mass in Skegness at 8.30 a.m. and in Spilsby at about 4.15 p.m. Cost £15-00. We would be grateful if people could pay this sum next weekend, if possible. We shall be calling at Brigg Garden Centre Cafe on return, where people may choose to have a meal (Please, check yourselves for the menu, for food allergies, etc., on 01652-650484 or look at 'brigg garden centre restaurant' for menus). There are several people with DBS checks on the pilgrimage. I would ask you to notify me as soon as possible, please, if you have any mobility or other health problems of which we should be aware, so that everyone's safety and well-being is assured.

I am sure that this will be a wonderful day of prayer in the company of Our Lady. We shall keep all the parish in our prayers during the day of pilgrimage, especially those who are sick and housebound. If you cannot be with us physically, we invite you to unite yourself to us in your prayers.

May God bless you now & always. **PLEASE PRAY FOR THE SICK:** John McGurk & Elizabeth Blythe. **DEVOTIONS.** The Rosary, especially **October Devotions** (5 decades each day in the month of the Rosary), to contemplate with Our Lady the mysteries of our redemption in Christ; we shall recite the Rosary before Sunday Mass; **First Fridays** of the month in honour of the Sacred Heart of Jesus (9 first Fridays = a novena of Fridays, confession and holy communion), to increase assurance of being repentant and of dying with the support of the sacraments, if needed; **First Saturdays** of the month in honour of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (5 first Saturdays, confession and holy communion), for reparation for sin, esp blasphemy, & conversion of Russia. **PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL:** We hope to try to recuperate those who have perhaps drifted away through Covid or for other reasons over the years by making contact with them, inviting them to return, organising Talks on the Faith, advertised by leaflets to attract interest. To make contact with the many tourists and visitors, we shall try to devise leaflets/ cards to be distributed to hotels, caravan sites, next year. To welcome Ukrainian and other immigrants, especially Catholics, we are still seeking advice from local authorities; cards will be translated into Ukrainian. Without any rushed decisions, since hasty judgments do not usually produce good fruits, it is intended to try to look at these aspects of our mission in the months to come, with a view to developing a way of responding to them over the next few years, which may be successful pastorally. Talks on the Faith, as part of our preparation for the celebration of the anniversary of dedication of the church in Spilsby and for the dedication of the church in Skegness in 2025, to focus on the mysteries of faith (1st year), life of disciples in care for human life, sexuality and marriage, and justice (2nd year), and the sacraments and prayer (3rd year). **PRAYERS NEEDED:**

1. **the end to the war in the Ukraine**, following the plea of Pope Francis, we renew our prayers that the war in the Ukraine may be ended soon, to put an end to the killing and destruction, to enable people in those regions to resume a peaceful life, to limit the wider damage to food supplies, the economy and to rebuild the international order on the basis of justice, security and peace. The need for this prayer has become even more urgent in the last few days, with the threat of nuclear action.

2. **peace between Israel and Palestine**, following a major increase in tensions this week.
3. **peace in our cities**, where racial and cultural tensions have erupted into sporadic violence.
