

POPE EMERITUS BENEDICT XVI, R.I.P. Pope Benedict died on 31st December, his funeral Mass and burial took place in the Vatican on 5th January. We pray for the repose of his soul and thank God also for the understanding of and love for the faith that he communicated in his writings, his teachings and his pastoral ministry throughout his years as a priest and bishop, and also as Pope. I offered Mass for the repose of his soul in Skegness yesterday and shall offer a Mass for him in Spilsby at 12.00 noon on Tuesday next.

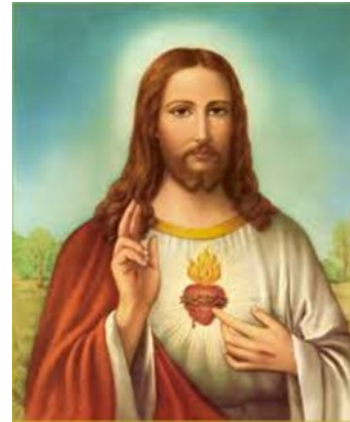
At his opening address to the Church as Pope, upon the acceptance of his election as Pope in April, 2005, the new Pope had spoken of himself as “a humble servant in the vineyard of the Lord”. That is all that each and every one of us, as baptised disciples of Christ, can ever wish to be.

At the general audience on Wednesday, 4th Jan., Pope Francis said of Pope Benedict: “His acute, but respectful thinking was not something designed to draw attention to himself, but it was ecclesial (focused upon the Church) because he sought to accompany us towards our encounter with Jesus. Taking us by the hand, Jesus, crucified but risen from the dead, the Living One and the Lord, was the destination to which Pope Benedict has led us. May he help us to discover in Christ the joy of believing and the hope of life.” At the homily he delivered during the funeral Mass on 5th Jan., Pope Francis stated: “Benedict, faithful friend of the Bridegroom (Jesus), may your joy be complete, as you hear his voice now and for ever”. He added that the ecclesial community (the Church) wanted “to commend our brother into the hands of the Father”.

Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord,
and let perpetual light shine upon him.
May he rest in pace. Amen.
