PARISH PASTORAL PROGRAMME: We hope to try to recuperate those who have perhaps drifted away through Covid or for other reasons by making contact with them, inviting them to return, organising Talks on the Faith, advertised by leaflets to attract interest. To make contact with the many tourists and visitors, we shall try to devise leaflets/ cards to be distributed to hotels, caravan sites, next year. To welcome Ukrainian and other immigrants, especially Catholics, we are still seeking advice from local authorities; cards will be translated into Ukrainian. Without any rushed decisions, since hasty judgments do not usually produce good fruits, it is intended to try to look at these aspects of our mission in the months to come, with a view to developing a way of responding to them over the next few years, which may be successful pastorally. Talks on the Faith, as part of our preparation for the celebration of the anniversary of dedication of the church in Spilsby and for the dedication of the Church in Skegness in 2025, to focus on the mysteries of faith (1st year), life of disciples in care for human life, sexuality and marriage, and justice (2nd year), and the sacraments and prayer (3rd year). Pope Francis' advance notice of the Holy Year of 2025 included a request to prepare for this by studying the four 'constitutions' (the major documents) of the Second Vatican Council, on divine revelation, the liturgy, the nature of the Church, the pastoral mission of the Church. We could integrate this into our programme, including divine revelation and the Church in the mysteries of the faith, pastoral mission in the life of disciples, and liturgy in praver and the sacraments. Talks on the Faith begin in Lent - Mon. 10.45 - 11.45am & Tues. 6.30-7.30pm (SK hall); Thurs.12.00 noon -1.00pm (SP).

THE SACRA-MENT OF THE SICK: For some years now, the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, 11th February, has been declared World Day of Prayer for the Sick. As in many parishes, we shall be celebrating the Sacrament of the Sick on this weekend of 11th-12th February. Proper candidates for this sacrament are Catholics who, apart from being baptised, have been confirmed and have made their first Holy Communion and who have begun to be in danger of death (not necessarily imminently) from sickness or from old age. This certainly includes anyone who has a serious illness, anyone with a serious underlying health condition, anyone about to undergo an important operation, as well as those who have become infirm through age. Those proper candidates who cannot come to church I have seen in the last week and have given them the sacraments; along with all the sick of the parish, the Mass of Our Lady of Lourdes which I am celebrating on 11th will be for them. PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL: The liturgy for Lent, Holy Week and Easter was planned, as also in general terms Stations of the Cross. In Spilsby these will alternate between Our Lady & the English Martyrs and St. James's, although the time needs to be altered from 6.00pm in the past to 5.30pm because of bell-ringing at St. James's. We discussed also the Pastoral programme for the parish of Talks on the Faith, etc.—see the back page of the Bulletin, with possible times to meet. WORK ON THE CHURCH ROOF: on the two porches in Spilsby, will take place in the week beginning 27th February. It will involve the closure of the church during those days. Towards the end of that week, the inspection of the church roof in Skegness will take place, although that will not involve the closure of the church. IN **PREPARATION FOR LENT**, which begins on 22nd February, it is important for each of us to decide ahead of time the particular penance we are going to adopt in order to use this holy season well, to prepare for Holy Week and the Sacred Triduum of our redemption: particular prayers each day, Stations of the Cross each Friday and even daily, daily Mass or an extra Mass in the week, a particular gesture of charity each day or each week - to help us in our spiritual combat against sin (a specific sin?) and to grow closer to Christ every day.
