

THE BLESSED TRINITY. Referring to “the ancient Tradition and the doctrine and the faith of the Catholic Church, which ... the Lord handed down, the Apostles preached and the Fathers preserved”, St. Athanasius wrote: “The Trinity, which is recognised in the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, is holy and perfect, having no adulteration of that which is foreign or external. It is not made of creator and created matter, but is endowed with the complete power of creating and giving energy; in its nature it is one and the same, undivided, and in giving life and in its activity it is one. For the Father makes all things through the Word in the Holy Spirit, and in that way the unity of the Trinity is preserved. Thus, in the Church One God is preached, who is ‘above all things, through all things and in all things’ ..., above all things as the Father, the first principle and origin, through all things, through the Word, and in all things in the Holy Spirit.” (St. Athanasius, A Letter, *Divine Office*, III, pp. 11-12).

GIFT FROM JANET & PATRICK DOYLE to our church in Spilsby - '1535 The Breaking of the Storm - 1935'"This beautiful picture has been specially painted by Dom Pedro Subercaseaux, OSB, of Quarr Abbey to commemorate the fourth centenary of the first martyrdoms in the Reformation storm which wrecked old Catholic England. Seen through the archway is the White Tower, the central keep of the Tower of London, in which Blessed John Fisher and Blessed Thomas More were imprisoned at the time when the scene of our picture occurred. Blessed Thomas More, looking out of his cell window actually witnessed it and commented to his daughter, Margaret, on the cheerfulness with which the Reformation Proto-Martyrs faced their death. The date was 4th May, 1535. In the centre of the group are the three Carthusian priors, in their cream-coloured habits, Blessed John Houghton of the London Charterhouse, Blessed Lawrence of Beauvale, Nottinghamshire, and Blessed Augustine Webster of Axholme, Lincolnshire. To the right of the Carthusians are two priests in black. The first is Blessed John Haile of Isleworth and previously of Chelmsford, Proto-martyr of the diocesan clergy. Next to him, his habit marked with a red cross, is Blessed Richard Reynolds, Brigittine monk of Syon Abbey, Middlesex. They are about to be tied to the hurdles, one of which is in the foreground, in which they were dragged to Tyburn, where they were hanged, drawn and quartered. Their sole offence was that they refused to acknowledge Henry VIII as the only supreme head of the Church in England. The artist was well-known in Europe and America for his skill as a water-colour painter before he became a monk.
