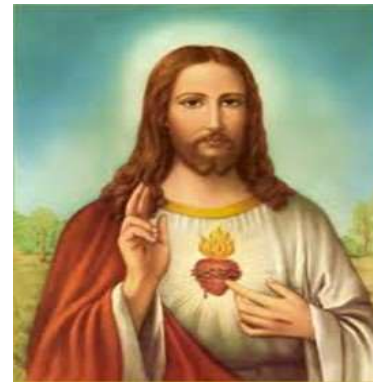
But now, now, it is the Lord who speaks, come back to me with all your heart, fasting, weeping, mourning.
