Some Biblical Pointers for Lent.

"Repent and believe the Good News." (Mk. 1:14-15)

"It was God who reconciled Himself to us through Christ and gave us the work of handing on this reconciliation ... and the appeal we make in Christ's name is 'Be reconciled to God' ". (2 Cor 5: 18, 20).

But now, now, it is the Lord who speaks, come back to me with all your heart, fasting, weeping, mourning. Let your hearts be broken, not your garments torn; turn to the Lord, your God again, for He is all tenderness and compassion, slow to anger, rich in graciousness, and ready to relent. Who knows if He will not turn again, will not relent, will not leave a blessing as He passes; oblation and libation for the Lord your God? Sound the trumpet in Zion; order a fast; proclaim a solemn assembly, call the people together, summon the community, gather the children, even the infants at the breast. Let the bridegroom leave his bedroom and the bride her alcove. Between altar and vestibule, let the priests, the ministers of the Lord, lament. Let them say: 'Save Your people, Lord. Do not make Your heritage a thing of shame, a by-word for the nations. Why should it be said among the nations: 'Where is their God?' (Joel 2:12-17).

"My people are diseased through their disloyalty ... Ephraim, how could I part with you. Israel, how could I give you up? ... My heart recoils from it, my whole being trembles at the thought. I will not destroy Ephraim again, for I am God, not man, I am the Holy One in your midst and have no wish to destroy (Hos. 11: 7-10).

Israel, come back to the Lord, your God ... What has Ephraim to do with idols any more, when it is I who hear his prayer and care for him? ... For the ways of the Lord are straight and virtuous men walk in them, but sinners stumble." (Hos. 14:1, 9-10).

MASS FOR THE SICK: today, Sat./Sun., 10th-11th February (11th would have been the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes), the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be administered to the sick of the parish at the Masses (and will be brought to those sick who cannot come to church in the days before and after those dates). This sacrament is to be given to those Catholics who have received all of the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion) and who are in danger of death, have become seriously ill or who suffer from an underlying serious condition, or who have become infirm through age. RECEPTION INTO FULL COMMUNION WITH THE CATHOLIC **CHURCH**: I am very pleased to say that we have six candidates this year (Linda Arger, Philip Hudson, Julian Day, Charlotte Dunn, Paul Mobbs and Fraser Rush), who will be received into full communion, will be confirmed and will receive their first holy communion at the Easter Vigil. I ask all of our community to pray especially for them all, to support them in the final stages of their journey, especially during Lent. **PREPARATION FOR LENT**: Lent begins this week on Ash Wednesday. We should each choose a penance, which we will perform each day and perhaps also each week, giving up something such as drink or sweets, saying some additional prayers, coming to a week-day Mass, coming to the stations of the Cross each Friday, doing some work of charity, etc. To mark Lent as a penitential season, in which we try to prepare ourselves spiritually to celebrate Holy week and the central mysteries of our faith at the Easter Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday), the beginning and the end are marked by fasting and abstinence on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting obliges all from 18 until their 60th year (unless they are ill), to eat just one main meal that day, with a light collation otherwise; abstinence from meat obliges those over 14. Booklets for prayer and reflection during Lent, ('Walk with me' for Lent, 2024) are available at £1-00 each. WORKS IN PROGRESS: Handrails to the ramps outside Sacred Heart church and hall and by the new concrete path to the hall, and a new boiler house door are being installed. After bleeding the radiators, the church boiler in Spilsby has been checked, so the heating should be more efficient. STATIONS OF THE CROSS: 5.15pm (SK); 6.00pm SP, alternating between our church and ST. James's – this week our church.

MANY THANKS: for a very generous donation of £500-00 (Spilsby), to go to the cost of new Lectionaries there later this year. **GIFT AID**: This is a way for us to earn extra money on your offerings...it's free money from the government.
