## Passiontide, including Holy Week.

"Though he was in the form of God, Jesus did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped. He emptied Himself, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And, being found in human form, He humbled Himself and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross. Therefore, God has highly exalted Him and bestowed on Him the Name which is above every name, that, at the Name of Jesus, every knee should bow, In heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God, the Father." (Phil. 2:6-11)

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord: Today, we commemorate Our Lord's entry into Jerusalem before His Passion, the crowds greeting Him with palms, shouting 'Hosanna to the Son of David'. We read the Passion from Ss. Matthew, Mark

**[Wednesday: Chrism Mass** <u>in the Cathedral</u> (transferred from Holy Thursday) – Blessing of the holy oils of Catechumens, of the Sick and consecration of the Sacred Chrism by the Bishop, as well as renewal by priests of the promises made at their Ordination – celebration of the institution of the ministerial priesthood.]

Holy Thursday: Mass of the Lord's Supper: Solemn commemoration of the institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper, and of the priesthood, and of the service of sacred ministries; procession with holy oils, washing of feet (optional) and procession with Blessed Sacrament to Altar of Repose, adoration, stripping of altar after Mass.

Good Friday: Liturgy of the Passion: solemn commemoration of Passion and Death of Our Lord, including Passion of St. John, general Intercessions for the whole Church, unveiling and veneration of the Cross and Holy Communion, with hosts consecrated

at Mass the night before. (also Stations of the Cross, SK, 6.00 p.m.)

**Holy Saturday: Easter Vigil and first Mass of Easter**: Blessing of New Fire and of Paschal Candle, procession with Paschal Candle, *Exsultet*; Liturgy of the Word (preparation of our salvation in Old Testament; *Gloria*, New Testament reading, Easter *Alleluia*, and Gospel), Liturgy of Baptism, blessing of and sprinkling with holy water, Baptism, Reception into full Communion and Confirmation, Liturgy of the Eucharist, including First Holy Communion.

Try to join us for the celebration of the central mysteries of our faith during the Sacred Triduum (sacred three-days); it will renew us all in the faith, support and welcome fully into our community the candidates for whom we have been praying especially during Lent, and be the best way we can prepare to celebrate Our Lord's resurrection at Easter.
