

**A SPECIAL YEAR FOR THE PARISH:** Next year, 2025, it will be 350 years since the main apparition of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to St. Margaret Mary Alacocque, associated with the shrine of the Sacred Heart at Paray-le-Monial in Burgundy in France, now cared for especially by the Community of Emmanuel. Next year both churches in our parish will celebrate important anniversaries, the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the opening of the new Sacred Heart church in Skegness and the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the dedication of the church of Our Lady and the English Martyrs, Spilsby. Martyrdom is the greatest possible form of dedication to Jesus and so both parts of the parish can truly be united in a year of preparation, in which we prepare to celebrate the past, the living faith of our families, the memory and inspiration of those who have gone before us, but also to renew our own faith, our own personal dedication and our dedication as a parish, as a living cell of the People of God, to Our Lord. The Sacred Heart is the core of God's mercy, divine mercy, brought fully into our world of sin, suffering and death in the very body of Jesus when He was born for us, revealed as His unlimited love for the Father in His perfect sacrifice on the Cross, and at the same time as the unlimited love of God towards each one of us, as He shed His Blood for us, and as, in His resurrection, He reconciled us to the Father, forgiving us, opening to us mortals the gift of eternal life, of unending, perfect communion of love with the Father, in Him, through the Holy Spirit. We pray that we may use this Year to grow in faith, deepen our prayer, strengthen our service of God in His Church, and be ever more effective witnesses to the saving, transforming power of the Sacred Heart of Jesus (martyr = witness to Christ by shedding of blood) in our world).

Proposals for this Year of Preparation in our Parish.

- Talks on the Faith, to focus on prayer, including prayer as a way to understand the meaning of the sacraments.
- Four special celebrations, two in each church, on four of the sacraments, with invited priests to lead them
- Pilgrimages to focus on the Sacred Heart, Our Lady & English Martyrs (Maryvale, Birmingham first Sacred Heart shrine in England and 'vale' dedicated to Our Lady)/ Martyrs' chapel at Tyburn, London, where many martyrs died and where relics are kept, with a visit to St. James's Palace, where there is an icon of St. Claude de la Colombière, Spiritual Director to St. Margaret Mary Alacocque, whose visions at Paray-le-Monial, France, 350 years ago next year inspired the Sacred Heart devotion, which St. Claude first preached in England/ to St. Mary's, Louth, where there is a stained-glass window to St. Eustace White, one of the Lincolnshire Martyrs, and perhaps to Melwood, shrine to St. Augustine Webster and other Lincolnshire Martyrs.)
- Invite a French Bishop, part of the Emmanuel Community, which looks after the major Sacred Heart shrine at Paray-le-Monial, to come to the parish to preside and to preach at Masses one weekend.

Peter Coates, who are ill. **CONGRATULATIONS:** Our prayers for and our good wishes to Pauline and Peter Holmes and also to Rosemary and Lawrence Whittle; both couples celebrate the Golden Jubilee of the wedding on 10<sup>th</sup> August. **HOLY YEAR, 2025:** *'Spes non confundit* 'Hope does not deceive'. **NEW LECTIONARIES:** The Church's liturgical texts, including Scriptural texts used in the liturgy were translated into various languages after the Second Vatican Council. The Roman Missal, issued by Pope Paul VI in 1970, and the Lectionaries (books with the readings from Scripture) emerged around the same time. Some of the translations from the Latin, in different languages, were rushed and some too loose and hence a revision of both the Roman Missal and of the Lectionaries (Scripture readings) was ordered by the Congregation for Sacraments and Divine Worship in Rome, under the authority of the Pope. The new Roman Missal came out in English about ten years ago; the new Lectionaries in English, approved by the Congregation in Rome, will be ready in October and must be used in all churches from the First Sunday of Advent. There are four volumes (1. Major Seasons, Sundays of Ordinary Time and Solemn feasts, 2. Weekdays of Ordinary Time (cycle I), 3. Weekdays of Ordinary Time (cycle II), 4. Special Celebrations (Baptisms, Marriage, other sacraments, Funerals, etc.). I am enormously grateful to the persons who have given donations in Spilsby and in Skegness which have covered the cost of those Lectionaries in both places. The parish cannot afford to buy the new (red) edition of the small Sunday Missal, previously blue book, by Redemptorist Publications, cost £9-95 per copy; I am most grateful to all those who have signed the form to buy personal copies at £10-00 per copy and to all who have 'sponsored' copies for others. In this way and with a rebate to parishes (not to individuals) for multiple purchases, we shall be able to cover books for all, including visitors. Many thanks for your great generosity.
